## Health Corner



#### Stress-Proof Your Morning

- In the morning, give yourself 10-20 minutes to meditate. How to begin: Close your eyes and focus on a single word (such as "calm"), a sound (such as rushing water) or an image (such as a cloud).
- Use water as a form of relaxation. Take a hot shower (but not too hot or too long, remembering to
  conserve water). The stream of water massages your back and neck muscles, helping you relax all over.
- Eat breakfast! You won't be starving by mid-day, leaving you better able to handle crises. Examples of stress-fighting foods: a glass of low fat milk with a bran muffin plus one piece of fresh fruit ... whole wheat waffle topped with fruit and sour cream.
- 4. *Pay attention to the details.* Consider taking a multivitamin with a glass of orange juice. Reason: Stress depletes your levels of magnesium . . . and Vitamin C and beta carotene.
- 5. *Ride quietly.* Turn off your car radio and enjoy a peaceful ride. You'll arrive at your destination more relaxed and better able to handle whatever comes your way.
