Freeman Scholarship is restricted to seniors planning to attend Benedict College. Applications are available on the BTW website: **bookertwashingtonfoundationsc.org**. Applications are scored independently by each committee member using a rubric. Scholarships are then awarded to the applicants with the four highest combined average scores.

The Scholarship committee reviews applications submitted. Scholarship recipients are recognized at the Heritage



Weekend Banquet and are acknowledged at the John Work Chorus on Sunday.

We congratulate and wish much success to Makaila Cameron Cordell, the recipient of the \$1,500 Beverly Garrick scholarship.


